Help is needed to empty out a tractor trailer of donated bunk bed items and take inventory of how many bunks there are total; how many of each finish/color; if all the bolts and brackets are there; what do we need to buy/replace, etc. If this happens before mid-May/whenever the cabins are finished and ready to move in, we will put everything back in the trailer in an organized fashion. 6 to 8, maybe 10 people are needed. We are getting everything off a tractor trailer type of trailer so there will not be tons of room for lots of people inside. The organizing and noting deficiencies is taking place outside on grass and gravel. One SLR person who knows bunk beds needs to be there to evaluate all the parts/right parts/in useable condition/etc. This complete task is weather dependent since we are setting everything out on the ground.

We will bring in the organized and inventoried material, including all bolts and brackets, to the cabins, 7 bunks for 7 cabins and 6 bunks for the ADA cabin. This will be several loads with several pickup trucks. Start assembly! Assembly can begin when the first bunk shows up, so some moving and some building can take place. Assembling a bunk is easier with 2 people and takes about 20-25 minutes once the routine is mastered. Number of people for this one? Assume at least 2 trucks, prefer 3. 2-3 people per truck for loading and delivering inside the building. Assembly – 2 per team and at least 3 to 4 teams (maybe more if we have enough tools). So that adds up to 15-17 people. Again, this will be weather dependent for moving unpackaged furniture.
